Curriculum

At Gilmerton Primary School we take a rights-based approach to our learning. In primary I we follow a play-based pedagogy led by the children's voice (Artice I2). We strive to get it right for every child and have an inclusive curriculum, respecting the varied learning styles of all our learners (Article 2 & Article I4).

What does this look like?



The child is in control, learning through play through enriching environments. Adults observe this play to plan play provocations and extend learning naturally. Article 12

ADULT LED

The learning is intentionally planned by the staff with set learning intentions. For example, we use Literacy Rich to teach literacy and SEAL to teach numeracy.

ADULT INITIATED

Quality provocations offer open ended play and independent learning opportunities.

PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT

We know how important parents and carers are in the learning journey- you are your child's first teacher. We want to work together to get it right for every child. We will share learning via Twitter, formal reporting, and informal conversations (for example, at the end of the day or via phone call/email)

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT


We are lucky to live in a multiculturally rich community. Reflecting on this within our school is important. We do this through learning about traditions, cultural events and celebrations.

The School Day




16th August- all children attend

Monday- Thursday 8.45am- 2:45pm Friday- 8.45am-12.15pm


Throughout the day, learners will have a range of child-led, adult-led and adult-initiated experiences, learning across the 8 curriculum areas. (Article 28 & Article 31)
