HOME LEARNING EVALUATION AND NEXT STEPS





YOU ASKED

01

From parent and staff feedback, we knew that our Home Learning Policy and practices had to be updated. Across the school very few pupils engaged in home learning.

02

Currently, each class receive a class newsletter with a choice board / grid of activities once a term. This is sent digitally via Parent Pay. Teachers also send home spelling and information on accessing apps and platforms at home.

03

P1-P3 receive reading books once a book has been covered in class. Choice boards also include Teams tasks for most year groups to help us continue to use our digital skills taught in school.





WHAT WE DID...

During session 2023 / 2024 we surveyed all members of our school community on their views of home learning.

We asked our pupils - P1-P3 completed our survey as a class
P4-P7 completed our survey individually

We asked our teachers

We asked our parents and carers (72 families responded 20% of our school community)



68% of responses noted that they engage in home learning

40% of responses noted that they found home learning useful

30% of responses noted that they did not enjoy completing home learning

Top home learning activities:

1. practicing spelling activities
2. completing challenges on apps or websites
3. taking a reading book home.

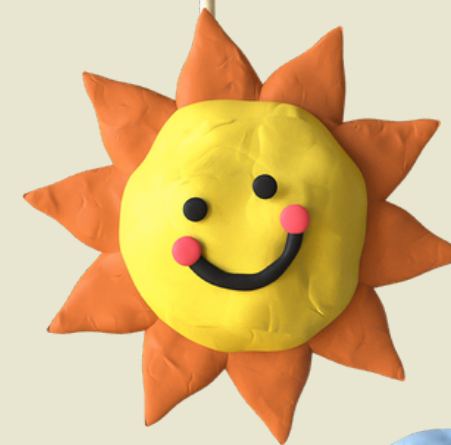
Teacher responses

From tracking data, around 30% of pupils engage in home learning

Those pupils who do engage, engage with spelling, reading and apps / websites

Staff feel disheartened when they spend a lot of time creating home learning that very few pupils engage with.

Staff do not note marked impact on progress as a result of home learning



Parent / Carer feedback

From the 72 responses, 83%
noted that their child engage
with home learning

Top home learning activities;

1. Reading
2. Spelling
3. Apps / Websites

Parents / carers value spelling
and reading home learning

The majority of responses
noted that the amount of
home learning was just right.

86% wanted home learning for
their child

A number of families noted
that family life is busy and
that it is difficult to fit in
home learning too

Primary 4-7

- 1 We will continue to send out a termly newsletter
- 2 Each pupil will receive a list of apps / websites with login details
- 3 We will send home spelling words weekly
- 4 We will send home Big Maths Learn Its termly
- 5 Pupils are encouraged to read for enjoyment at home
